### My Reflections On the 32ND General Synod - Rev. Peter E. Bauer

This was my first visit to General Synod as a clergy delegate. I had attended the synod in 2011 when it was held in Tampa, FI when I was awarded the Joyce And Bob Dell Award for excellence in Mental Health Ministries.

My impression is that The United Church of Christ is at a crossroads. Our membership is continuing to decline. According to CARD, United Church of Christ, we were at 880,000 plus in membership in 2017, 2018 we dropped to 853,000 plus and now for 2019 we will be listed at 823,000 plus members. Our decline continues to be precipitous.

General Synod announced the creation of two new hybrid conferences: the new TA1 Conference comprising the former Massachusetts, Connecticut and Rhode Island Conferences. Also, there has been a similar configuration that will occur between South Dakota, Nebraska and Iowa.

Clearly, we have a trend emerging here. I would conjecture that we could see further unions and mergers between existing conferences in the future. This will generate questions as to how these mega-conferences can be managed, funded and how communication will occur effectively between conference staff and churches and clergy. I have my reservations regarding whether or not you can manage a new configuration like this by using Skype alone. I am also skeptical as to whether these new conferences will be cost effective.

I also learned that in Southern California Conference, there has been a boom on the sale of church properties. Three church buildings in Pasadena ,Altadena and Santa Ana have been sold for a total of 18 Million. The Santa Ana congregation are now worshipping in a recreation room at an assisted living complex. Again, this raises questions regarding what the future of church congregations will look like and what help existing conferences can provide for them.

General Synod also revealed the fight regarding the future of leadership in the denomination. Rev. John Dorhauer was re-elected with 64% percent approval, yet there appears to be a significant resistance to the outcome of this election. Many delegates expressed their desire that the General President of The United Church of Christ should be a woman or a person of color. My impression is that Rev. Karen Georgia Thompson, now at Global Ministries, and Rev. Traci Blackmon, Assistant to the General Minister will be prime candidates in the 2024 election for UCC General minister.

I was impressed that General Synod welcomed Professor Matthew Desmond of Princeton University, to present on his ground-breaking research regarding eviction in America and referencing his Eviction Lab project at Princeton www.EvictionLab.com and the need for further affordable housing www.JustShelter.com.

I was also pleased to be a part of the group that worked on the forced world-wide migration resolution. There are great challenges facing humanity now with the current increase in refugees (now estimated at 37,000 new refugees per day). According to Dr. Peter Makari of Global Ministries the United States is paying Jordan 1 billion per year to take care of refugees.

The European Union is paying Turkey 1 billion euros each year to take care of refugees. Unfortunately, the World Bank through its policies has created another 3.1 Million refugees.

All of these indicators suggest a turbulent time ahead for The United Church of Christ. I hope that our proceedings and decisions as the Board of Directors for South Central Conference will provide stability, good governance and wise stewardship of our resources as we seek to be



advocates for the churches and clergy of our conference.

## Items for Asylum Seekers Backpacks

**The "Backpack Project"** was conceived in order to fulfill a need for asylum seekers: to provide them with a Survival Kit to use during their initial travel in the USA. When asylum seekers are dropped off at the SA bus station or the airport, they arrive with very little. Very often they carry their whole world in a gym-bag-like carry-on. IWC (Interfaith Welcome Committee in San Antonio) decided to put together a package of items to hand over to them to help them on their journey. While there are items in the package that the entire family can use, we also include small toys, a coloring book with crayons, pens and pencils for the children. If the family has a fairly newborn or a toddler, we also include diapers and wipes. We give one backpack to each family, or two if there are at least 5 members in the family. As one can see from the list of items in each backpack, we try to provide the essential items we think they will need.

- 1 small note pad Coloring book and crayons
