Participant shares bowler's point of view

One Sunday morning back in late August, I was ambushed by one of the sweetest little old ladies in our congregation with a proposal, which I initially discounted as being outlandish – “you’ve got be kidding.”

I’m 80 years old, and I haven’t been bowling for more than 30 years. . . I sold my bowling ball, bag and shoes when I moved into our apartment at Edenhill Communities. No, I don’t think so. But this little old lady would not let me go, and she asked me again and again. And it is one thing to turn down an invitation, based on the fact that I’m 80 years old, but when the person who is asking you to join her league is 90, well, that excuse doesn’t hold much water.

Well, she broke through my resistance, and I agreed to give it a try. What did I have to lose, except my dignity, when I found out that I couldn’t even lift the ball, or keep it out of a gutter, or score higher than a little old 90 year old.

On my first night out, I had to use a lane ball, (an old, well-used and often chipped and ill-fitting ball), and I picked it up and walked up to the lane, looked down at those 10 perfectly set pins and my mind said, “you remember what you are supposed to do,” but

my body said, “You got to be kidding!” After I let the ball loose on those perfectly set pins, they remained “perfectly set.” And the next few balls followed that same pattern. I began to feel this was a BIG mistake. But then something happened, and I began knocking some pins down.

And I got so good that they gave me a 101-pin handicap. So I could go home and tell Sandy (my wife) I bowled 170 that night. She was impressed.

After a few weeks, I was bowling 135 without the added handicap, and each week it has been improving, and I am having fun and getting exercise, and meeting new people. And so I want to thank that little 90-year-old lady for persisting. You are not too old to start something new or to resurrect an old sport, bringing it back to life.

To be sure, I don’t yet have the same zing that I used to have, but hey, I’ve only been at this for four weeks, and I am 30 years older. But the best part is, I am having fun doing it. Thanks, Dari.

Oh, by the way, our team is called “The Holy Rollers,” and we bowl on Friday nights at 6:30. We have only two members on our teams, but we are having fun.

Heart of Texas Association News

Evangelical UCC in Lyons welcomed Jacqueline Lamensky as their new designated pastor at the end of July. She comes to Lyons after serving Friedens United Church of Christ in Bern, Kansas for almost five years. Many here in the South Central Conference and in the Heart of Texas Association are also welcoming her back since Jacqueline spent her childhood at Immanuel Church in Needville, later was part of Faith UCC in New Braunfels and Friedens UCC in Geronimo, and spent many years at Slumber Falls Camp as a camper, counselor, and intern. After graduating from Eden Theological Seminary in St. Louis in 2013, Jacqueline was ordained at Friedens in Geronimo. As she has written in her introduction to the Lyons church, "I am also born, baptized, confirmed, and ordained in the United Church of Christ, it runs in my veins!" I know many of us in this Association will get to know her well. We rejoice with Evangelical Lyons in this new time in the life of their church and pray that, together, the church and Jacqueline will have a blessed and fruitful ministry.



Our Heart of Texas Committee on Ministry, at its recent meeting, interviewed Cameron Burton for ordination and voted to approve him for an Ecclesiastical Council at the Fall HOT Association meeting. Cam is the Spiritual Care Coordinator for St. David's South Austin Medical Center, where he has served as a chaplain for the past seven years. Cam is also certified as a professional chaplain by the Association of Professional Chaplains. Cam comes to us from the United Methodist Church, which means his path to ordination has differed from our usual process. Normally, in the United Church of Christ, Cam would have been ordained to his chaplaincy position several years ago, but the United Methodist ordination and ministry standing of chaplains is somewhat different from ours. Because there is a professional requirement that he be endorsed for chaplaincy by our denomination as soon as possible, we anticipate that he will be ordained shortly after his Ecclesiastical Council pending a vote to approve him for ordination.

Our Committee on Ministry, at its recent meeting, also granted a local chaplaincy endorsement to CJ Wood, who was ordained at St. Paul UCC in Corpus Christi in June to her chaplaincy work in the Christus Spohn Health System. CJ has recently accepted a chaplaincy position at Seton Medical Center in Austin. We look forward to welcoming her to ministry in Austin.

Finally, plan to come to the **Fall Association Meeting of the Heart of Texas Association, Saturday, November 16th at Trinity Church of Austin.** We will begin at **11 a.m. (with registration starting at 10:30).** Included in the time will be worship; the Ecclesiastical Council of Cam Burton; possibly an additional Ecclesiastical Council pending the Committee on Ministry's work at its upcoming meeting; a business meeting; and, as always, lunch, good fellowship, and community sharing. Congregational Church of Austin and Trinity are partnering together as hosts. We hope you will plan to join us!
