I always feel the sadness and concern when we serve receptions for the families after funerals. I love it when the children have Sunday School around me. I don't like the feel of glue and glitter, but I do love the fell of colored sugar and sprinkles when it's cookie baking time! And the youth make great pizzas, too! I've heard jokes, community news, politics, and, yes, a little gossip! But very seldom have I heard anger and dissention — frustration and confusion, maybe — but not hurtful words.

I have loved the worship services in this building (Baese Hall). I was both glad and sorry when the new sanctuary was built. It left me a little lonely. But I'm still kept quite busy. People still meet and eat here. It has been an honor to be a part of this congregation. May God continue to bless you many more years. Keep the good food coming – I'm ready!


Monday December 4, 2006

I remember the Faith Extravaganza's we would have once a month for children and youth. These were held on Saturday mornings for 4-5 hours. Word went out throughout the neighborhood that parents could drop their children off for a morning of Bible study, games, trips, and fun. Church members contacted anyone they knew who had children. Some canvassed the neighborhood letting families know about Faith Extravaganza. Children and youth would invite their friends to come and join them. At one point the program grew to about 20-25 kids! All this from a church, which at the time had few if any children!

Among the special activities that the children did was to practice and perform plays. The plays would deal with something they could relate to. Sometimes these plays would be performed during the Sunday worship. I especially remember the Christmas plays that we use to do. They always added to the joy of the season.

Lunch would be served at the conclusion of the Saturday morning activities. Church members would sometimes bring food in for the children, or it would be prepared on site. Sometimes the children themselves would prepare their own meals, with supervision from the adults.

This program proved to be a marvelous outreach to children and families. Several families in the church today first had contact with Faith U.C.C. through the Saturday Extravaganza's. It was a lot of hard work, but it was worth it.

O God we give you thanks for caring and sharing and a church that reaches out to others. We give you thanks for children's laughter and for times of learning. We give you thanks for the children who went through the Saturday Extravaganza experiences and who are adults today. Be with us O God as we seek to minister to children and youth today. All in all my recollection of Faith Church had to include Slumber Falls Camp. In both instances the early days of our ministry here provided pleasant memories with warm reception and a bright potential for the continuing relationship between Faith Church and Slumber Falls Camp.
